

NCAC Cub Scout Day Camp 2009 “SPACE...a Cub Scout Universe”



Camp Tidbits

- Day Camps are conducted locally/regionally by an adult staff, with a professional staff advisor.
- Most camps start at 8:30 am and run through 3:00-4:00 pm, M-F.
- Registered Cub Scouts between the ages of 6 and 10 (or grade 1 and up) are eligible for day camp. First year Tiger Cubs (becoming a Tiger Cub after June 1, 2009) are considered to be in first grade on September 1, 2009 and are eligible for the discounted fee no matter when they sign up for camp (they must sign up 'hard copy' rather than online). Each Tiger Cub will need to have his Tiger Cub Partner with him at camp.
- Day Camp activities may include archery instruction, target shooting (bbs and/or slingshot), nature, crafts, aquatics activities, sports, Scout Skills, and other activities appropriate to the day camp location
- Packs sign up as a group, either online at www.boyscouts-ncac.org or by filling out and mailing/bringing the registration to the Marriot Scout Service Center, 9190 Rockville Pike, Bethesda, MD 20814.
- Each Cub Scout pays \$140 (early bird discount) by April 10, 2009. Later sign-ups are \$160 through May 22 and \$185 after that. No registrations will be accepted after the Thursday prior to the start of each camp. There will be no on-site registrations accepted.
- Registration fees include participation in all camp activities and programs, one themed t-shirt, commemorative patch, and water bottle. Lunch *is not* provided and should be sent with the camper. Extra t-shirts can be ordered prior to camp (\$10 for smaller sizes, \$12 for XXL and XXXL).
- Each group of five boys requires *at least* one adult who will walk with the den all day (not considered to be a staff member).
- Full-time, approved staff members will receive one free registration for their child at camp (and should not pre-pay for this child's registration). Each camp is will recruit and train their own volunteer staff to cover delivering the program to the Cub Scouts. Full-time volunteer staff should be age 14 or over and currently registered with the Boy Scouts of America.
- Each youth, den walker, and staff member is expected to have an appropriate medical form on file at the camp. These forms are available online at the day camp website.
- Advancement is not the goal of Cub Scout Day Camp. However, many times a specific camp will focus on rank achievements the participants may fulfill if they are fully active at the day camp. Records of these achievements are the responsibility of each individual camp and the directors.
